## SOMAH Wage Floor



The SOMAH Program provides job training and career-advancing opportunities for tenants of project sites and others in disadvantaged and environmental justice communities, especially those facing barriers to employment.

To ensure job trainees are paid comparably to local industry standards, SOMAH includes a wage floor. Trainees must be paid at **either the contractor's entry level rate or 1.4x the city or county minimum wage**, whichever is higher. If the local jurisdiction doesn't have a minimum wage, the California state minimum wage is applied.

As of first quarter 2021, the latest available state labor and wage data<sup>1</sup> indicates the 25th percentile hourly wage in the solar photovoltaic installers category was \$20.30 per hour. The median wage was \$23.75. Using the 1.4 multiplier brings the SOMAH job training wage floors within range of standard industry wages. The SOMAH Program Administrator will revisit the wage floor amounts as average salaries increase over time.
